The NSW Government Work Health and Safety Sector Plan, developed by SafeWork NSW with key sector stakeholders, was launched by Cluster Secretaries from across the NSW Government on 11 July 2018.

The Sector Plan includes specific measurable objectives to drive down injuries and fatalities across NSW Government workplaces. Clusters will create their own Action Plans to meet these objectives by 2022.

#### Clusters will:

- become role models in work health and safety
- improve employee engagement and productivity
- create real solutions for safer working conditions.

The Sector Plan will help achieve the national targets set out in the Australian Work Health and Safety Strategy 2012-2022, as well as the NSW Government's key target of 30% reduction in serious injuries and illnesses from now to 2022.
